

KIPP San Antonio is a network of FREE public schools of choice that will serve approximately 700 students in 5<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> grades during the 2010-2011 school year. As an open enrollment charter school, KIPP San Antonio welcomes all students that live inside Loop-410 (with the exception of students that are zoned for Alamo Heights ISD or any of the military base schools) to apply for admission regardless of past academic success, test scores or behavioral history. We do not administer any testing prior to the lottery.

- KIPP University Prep High School, Grades 9<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>
- KIPP Aspire Academy, Grades 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup>
- KIPP Camino Academy, Grade 5<sup>th</sup>

Enrollment in KIPP San Antonio schools conducted via a lottery. In the event that we have more applicants than available slots for a certain school and/or grade, we will conduct a public lottery to fill those slots.

Here is the application process for all KIPP San Antonio schools for the 2010-2011 school year:

1. **Parent Information Meeting.** All students and parents are highly encouraged to attend one of our parent information sessions to learn about our school's academics, culture and expectations.
  - Tuesday, February 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm at KIPP University Prep
  - Thursday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm at KIPP Aspire Academy
  - Tuesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6:00 pm at KIPP University Prep
  - Thursday, April 15<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm at KIPP Aspire Academy
  - Thursday, April 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm at KIPP Aspire Academy
2. **Lottery Application form.**
  - a. Complete a lottery application form and turn it in at one of the school offices. Lottery application forms are available at the school offices and at the Parent Information Meetings.
  - b. Lottery applications for KIPP University Prep must be completed and turned in to the school office no later than 5:00 pm on February 22, 2010.**
  - c. Lottery applications for KIPP Aspire Academy and KIPP Camino must be completed and turned in to the KIPP Aspire Academy office no later than 5:00 pm on April 30, 2010.**
3. **Lottery Night.**
  - a. KIPP University Prep will conduct its lottery in the school cafeteria at **6:00 pm on Tuesday, February 23, 2010.**
  - b. KIPP Aspire Academy and KIPP Camino Academy will conduct their lotteries in the KIPP Aspire gymnasium at **6:00 pm on Thursday, May 6, 2010.**
  - c. Siblings of currently enrolled KIPP San Antonio students have first priority for enrollment.
  - d. After all eligible siblings have been enrolled, and in the event that we have more applicants than available slots for a certain grade and/or school, all remaining applicants that have met the application deadline will be entered into a public lottery.
    - i. Student names will be drawn until all available slots at that grade and/or school have been filled.
    - ii. Students not selected in the lottery will be placed on a waiting list in the order that they drawn in the lottery.
  - e. After all eligible siblings have been enrolled, and in the event that we DO NOT have more applicants than available slots for a certain grade and/or school, then all applicants that have met the application deadline will be enrolled in the school.
  - f. The lottery is open to the public and students and parents are encouraged to attend.
4. **Applicants after the deadline.**
  - a. In the event that the school and/or grade has available slots, that student will be enrolled in the school.
  - b. In the event that the school and/or grade DOES NOT have any available slots, that student will be placed on the waiting list on a first come, first-served order.
5. **Enrollment.**
  - a. All students that have been selected for enrollment will be notified no later than one week following the lottery.
  - b. Formal enrollment paperwork for the student must be completed no later than two weeks following the lottery. If the enrollment paperwork has not been completed by this date, the student risks losing their slot.
  - c. All students selected for enrollment in grades 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> will be required to undergo placement testing to determine the appropriate grade for the student.
